Prayer of Affirmation (POA)

A. Definition.

- 1. The POA is speaking or declaring God's Word over yourself or situation. Example 1: I have been healed by the stripes of Jesus (1 Peter 2:24). Example 2: My God supplies all my need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus (Phil 4:19).
- 2. You are what the Bible says you are. You can do what the Bible says you can do. An affirmation is calling yourself what the Bible says you are.
- 3. Heb 10:23 AmpC It is professing your faith; the faith which you confess.
- 4. Examples: Jesus said only what the Father said.
 Joh 12:49 the Father gave me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak. 5:19 The Son does what the Father does.
 Gen 17:5 God changed Abram's name to Abraham (Father of many nations). This was an affirmation starting even before Sarah had a child.

B. The Process of Affirmations.

- 1. Mark 11:24 Affirmation starts as an expression of gratitude to God for answering your prayer.
- 2. Phil 4:6 You thank God for His answer as many times as you wish.
- 3. Tit 3:8 A faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly,
- 4. Affirmation continues as spiritual warfare.

Mark 11:23 if you don't doubt in your heart, you have what you say. Mark 5:28 AmpC For she kept saying, If I only touch His garments, I shall be restored to health.

Eph 6:17 And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God:

C. The Importance of Affirmations.

- 1. Eph 6:17 Use the Sword of the Spirit as a battering ram (Joshua 1:8)
- 2. Rom 4:17 Call things that be not as though they were.
- 3. Psalm 103:20 Releasing angels to work.
- 4. Rev 12:11 Overcoming by the Blood of the Lamb (Jesus' part) and by the word of our testimony (our part).

D. How to Affirm.

- 1. Confess your sins before you start affirming the Word (1 John 1:9).
- 2. The affirmation must be based on a Scripture (i.e., a promise of God).
- 3. The affirmation must contain the Name of Jesus.
- 4. Speaking the Prayer of Affirmation:

The affirmations must be spoken audibly through your lips.

The affirmations must be spoken in the past tense. [The prayer has been answered. Your request has already been done (spiritually)].
